

# Weekly Dry Season Situation Report in the Lower Mekong River Basin

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## **Key Messages**

Key messages for this weekly report are presented below.

#### Rainfall monitoring and forecast

- In the period of 03 10 November 2025, there has been moderate to heavy rainfall has been observed over the LMB including in the central and southern parts of Lao PDR, the eastern part of Cambodia, the 3S basin, and the Mekong delta.
- During 11 17 November 2025, the accumulated rainfall over the entire Lower Mekong Basin is distributed with light to moderate rain.

#### Water level monitoring and forecast

- At 22 key monitoring stations along the Mekong mainstream from 03 10 November 2025, water levels are below the long-term averages (LTAs) except for water level at Nongkhai and Paksane stations. However, the 6 monitoring stations remain in normal condition with respect to the flow threshold (PMFM Thresholds). It is also the same condition for Tan Chau and Chau Doc monitoring stations, which are significantly influenced by sea tidal fluctuation.
- In the period of 11 17 November 2025, the water levels from Chaing Saen and Luang Prabang are expected to decrease, while from Chaing Khan to Paksane, they are expected to increase. From Nakhon Phanom, water levels are expected to drop. At Tan Chau and Chau Doc stations, the water levels are predicted to be also fluctuated, resulting from the influence of sea tidal patterns. Water levels at all stations are expected to continue being above their long-term averages (LTAs).

#### **Drought condition and forecast**

- During 04 11 November 2025, the LMB is experiencing normal conditions, no drought over the region. The monitored drought is caused primarily by meteorological indicator and combined drought indicator.
- During 11 17 November 2025, the LMB is likely at normal conditions. No drought is forecasted for next week for the whole region.

#### 1 Introduction

This Weekly Dry Season Situation Report presents a preliminary analysis of the weekly hydrological situation in the Lower Mekong River Basin (LMB) for 03 - 10 November 2025. The trend and outlook for water levels are also presented.

This analysis is based on the daily hydro-meteorological data provided by the Mekong River Commission (MRC) Member Countries – Cambodia, Lao PDR, Thailand, and Viet Nam – and on satellite data. The water level indicated in this report refers to an above zero gauge of each station.

The report covers the following topics that are updated weekly:

- General weather patterns, including rainfall patterns over the LMB.
- Water levels in the LMB, including in the Tonle Sap Lake.
- Flash flood and drought situation in the LMB.
- Weather, water level and flash flood forecast, and
- Possible implications.

## **2** General Weather Patterns

From 11-17 November, it is forecasted that the moderate high-pressure system affected the upper and the central part of the Lower Mekong Basin while the strengthening northeast monsoon will prevail over the lower part. Light to moderate rain is expected over the region during this period

**Figure 1** presents mean sea level pressure over the region in the next 7 days.




Figure 1: Weather conditions over the LMB




Figure 2: Outlook of wet and dry conditions over the Asian countries by ASMC.

According to the ASEAN Specialised Meteorological Centre (ASMC, <a href="http://asmc.asean.org/home/">http://asmc.asean.org/home/</a>), the subseasonal weather outlook indicates that the Lower Mekong Basin (LMB) is likely in drier conditions in lower part. Moreover, the cooler conditions are predicted to occur almost entire LMB except for the upper part. Figure 2 shows the outlook of weather condition

from 10 to 23 November 2025 in Southeast Asia based on results from the NCEP model (National Centres for Environmental Prediction).




Figure 3: One tropical storm risk observed on 10 November 2025

Based on the JMA tropical storm (TS) information (https://www.jma.go.jp/jma/jma-eng/jma-center/rsmc-hp-pub-eg/RSMC\_HP.htm), there is one active NW pacific system as of 10 November 2025 as displayed in **Figure 3.** However, this tropical storm may not significantly affect the LMB.

## 3. Rainfall and Water Level Monitoring

#### 3.1. Rainfall monitoring




Figure 4: Weekly rainfall distribution over the LMB during 04 – 11 November 2025

The weekly accumulated rainfall based on the observed data provided by the MRC Member Countries – Cambodia, Lao PDR, Thailand, and Viet Nam – from 04 - 11 November 2025 (**Figure 4**). The moderate to heavy rainfall has been only observed over the LMB including the central and southern part of Lao PDR, the 3S basin, the eastern part of Cambodia, and the Mekong delta.

#### 3.2. Water level monitoring

The hydrological regimes of the Mekong mainstream are illustrated by recorded water levels and flows at key mainstream stations: at Chiang Saen to capture mainstream flows entering from the Upper Mekong Basin (UMB); at Vientiane to present flows generated by climate conditions in the upper part of the LMB; at Pakse to investigate flows influenced by inflows from the larger Mekong tributaries; at Kratie in Cambodia to capture overall flows of the Mekong Basin; and at Viet Nam's Tan Chau and Chau Doc to monitor flows to the Delta.




Figure 5: The key stations along LMB for river flood forecasting

The key stations along the LMB and their respective model application for River Flood Forecasting during the wet season from June to October and River Monitoring during the dry season from November to May are presented in **Figure 5**. The hydrograph for each key station is available from the MRC's River Flood Forecasting: <a href="http://ffw.mrcmekong.org/overview.php">http://ffw.mrcmekong.org/overview.php</a>.




Figure 6. Water level at the Jinghong hydrological station up to 10 November 2025.

During 03 – 10 November 2025, the observed water level (WL) at Jinghong hydrological station<sup>1</sup>, was almost constant and ranges between 536.94 m and 537.96 m, which are corresponding to the outflow between 1,450.00 m<sup>3</sup>/s to 1,930.00 m<sup>3</sup>/s (recorded on 7:00 am), respectively (**Figure 6**). The water level in Chiang Saen Station also indicated a slight fluctuation ranging from 4.52 m to 4.42 m. At the same period, the water level in Luang Prabang station also slightly increased with an approximate value of 0.28 m from 10.56 m to 10.84 m as compared to the previous week.

During the same period, the water levels observed at upper parts of the basin at Chiang Khan, Vientiane and Nongkhai have been stable as compared to the previous week. However, from Paksane to Pakse stations, the water levels have been decreasing. At Paksane, Nakhon Phanom, Thakhek, Mukdahan, Savannakhet, Khong Chiam, and Pakse station, the water levels have decreased from 6.12 m to 5.81 m, 4.74 m to 4.56 m, 6.07 m to 5.90 m, 5.00 m to 4.83 m, 3.45 m to 3.29 m, 7.09 m to 6.64 m, and 5.48 m to 4.96 m, respectively.

Moving down to the floodplain area at Stung Treng, Kratie, and Kampong Cham stations, water levels have been stable. At Phnom Penh (Bassac), Phnom Penh Port, Koh Khel, and Prek Kdam, water levels have also decreased from 8.14 m to 8.05 m, 6.96 m to 6.73 m, 6.86 m to 6.86 m, 5.80 m to 5.74 m, and 7.67 m to 7.51 m, respectively.

Similar to the previous week, the water levels from 03 to 10 November 2025 at Viet Nam's Tan Chau and Chau Doc fluctuated between their LTA values due to daily tidal effects from the sea. At the Tan Chau station, the water levels varied between 3.22 m and 3.05 m, while at the Chau Doc station, they ranged from 3.01 m and 2.84 m.

The water levels in key monitoring stations on 10 November 2025 are below their long-term averages (LTAs) except for the Luang Prabang station. Moreover, all stations with available PMFM thresholds are in normal conditions. The graphics of water level monitoring in all key stations are presented in **Annex A** and the weekly water levels and rainfall at each key station are summarised in **Annex B**.

At the end of the wet season, when water levels along the Mekong River subside, the outflow of the Tonle Sap Lake (TSL) returns to the Mekong River and then to the Delta. This phenomenon normally takes place between September and October. Based on flow observation at Prek Kdam monitoring station, the outflow of the Tonle Sap Lake took place since 14 September 2025.

The outflow flow is calculated based on a formula of rating-curves using by difference of water levels at Kompong Luong and Phnom Penh Port stations for slop and Prek Kdam as cross-section of the Lake. The formula of flow is as follows:

$$Flow = WL_{Prek\ Kdam}^{1.2} \times \sqrt{|WL_{Phnom\ Penh\ Port} - WL_{Kampong\ Luong}|}$$

Where, WL is water level in m (msl).

The seasonal changes of the inflow/reverse flow and the outflow of the TSL at Prek Kdam in comparison with the flows of 2020, 2021 and 2022, 2023, 2024 and their LTA level (1997–2024) are illustrated in **Figure 8**. Up to 10 November 2025, it was observed that the main outflow from Tonle Sap Lake has recessing **(Figure 8)**. This decreased outflow of Tonle Sap Lake was most likely caused by low inflows from its tributaries.

The seasonal changes in monthly flow volumes up to 10 November 2025 for the TSL compared with that in 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and their LTAs, and the fluctuation levels (1997–2024) are presented in **Table 1**. The mean monthly water volume of the Tonle Sap Lake in

October 2025 is higher than its LTA (about 105.02 %), and all recent years (2019 to 2024) during the same period (Figure 8 and Table 1).




Figure 7: Seasonal change of inflows and outflows of Tonle Sap Lake.




Figure 8. The seasonal change in monthly flow volume of Tonle Sap Lake.

## 4. Flash Flood in the Lower Mekong Basin

During the weekly monitoring period from 04 - 11 November, the LMB received moderate to heavy rain and thunderstorms in some areas.

According to the MRC-Flash Flood Guidance System (MRC-FFGS) and analysis, flash flood events detected with low to high level in some areas in Cambodia and Viet Nam on 07 November.

## 5. Drought Monitoring in the Lower Mekong Basin

### 5.2. Weekly drought monitoring from 04 – 10 November 2025

Drought monitoring data for 2025 are available from Monday to Sunday every week; thus, the reporting period is normally delayed by one day compared to Flood and Flash Flood reports. We adopt the Index of Soil Water Fraction (ISWF) data obtained from FFGS to represent soil moisture of agricultural indicator for both dry and wet seasons.

#### Weekly Standardised Precipitation Index (SPI1)




Figure 9: Weekly standardized precipitation index from 04 – 11 November.

Meteorological indicator shows that from 04 - 10 November 2025, as shown in **Figure 9**, the LMB was facing normal conditions, except some areas in the western part of Mekong Delta.

#### Weekly Index of Soil Water Fraction (ISWF)




Figure 10: Weekly Index of Soil Water Fraction from 04 - 11 November.

Soil moisture conditions from 04 - 10 November 2025, as displayed in **Figure 10**, the LMB was facing normal conditions, except some areas in the upper and central part of Lao PDR and the northern part of Cambodia.

<u>Note:</u> The index of soil water fraction presents the current soil water fraction conditions compared with normal month; therefore, it normally shows extremely dry during dry season which is completely different from SPI that is standardized to its specific month of the years. However, this does not mean that the areas are threatened by agricultural drought as generally during transition period of wet and dry seasons and dry season only the irrigated areas are used for agricultural plantation.

• Weekly Combined Drought Index (CDI)




Figure 11: Weekly Combined Drought Index from 04 - 10 November.

The combined drought indicator, Figure 11, shows that no drought over the LMB.

DFEW provides not only weekly monitoring and forecasting information but also a three-month forecast of drought indicators with seasonal outlook which are updated every month based on international weather forecast models. Details on drought forecast are described in section 6.4 of this report.

#### 6 Weather and Water Level Forecast and Flash Flood information

#### 6.1 Rainfall forecast




Figure 12: Accumulated rainfall forecast from CHIRP-GFS (11 - 17 November 2025)

During 11 - 17 November 2025, the accumulated rainfall over the entire Lower Mekong Basin is distributed with light to moderate rain based on CHIRPS-GFS (**Figure 12**).

#### 6.2 Water level forecast

In Chiang Saen monitoring station, the water level is expected to be fluctuated over the forecasting period of 11 - 17 November 2025. However, it will slightly increase from 4.42 m to 4.28 m. The water level in Luang Prabang stations affected by backwater is likely slightly decreasing from 10.84 m to 10.66 m.

Along the Mekong mainstream, the water levels at upper stretch at Chiang Khan, Vientiane, Nongkhai, and Paksane stations, water levels will slightly rise of approximately 0.20 m, 0.34 m, 0.27 m, and 0.00 m, respectively. Moreover, water levels from Nakhon Phanom downward are expected to drop. At Nakhon Phanom, Thakhek, Mukdahan, Savannakhet, Khong Chiam, and Pakse, the water levels are likely dropping -0.22 m, -0.23 m, -0.14 m, -0.15 m, -0.26 m, and -0.34 m, respectively.

Moving down at Stung Streng, Kratie, Kompong Cham, Phnom Penh Port, Phnom Penh (Bassac), Phnom Penh Port, Koh Khel, Neak Luong, and Prek Kdam stations, water levels will slightly drop of approximately -0.19 bm, -0.80 m, -0.82 m, -0.45 m, -0.47 m, -0.30 m, -0.35 m, and -0.45 m, respectively.

For the Tan Chau station on the Mekong River and Chau Doc station on the Bassac River, water levels will be fluctuating approximately ranging from 3.05 m to 2.81 m and 2.84 m to 2.67 m, respectively, following daily tidal effects from the sea.

The water levels at key stations are forecasted to be above their LTAs from 11 to 17 November 2025.

#### 6.3 Flash Flood Information

Flash flood events are not likely to happen in the LMB next week. However, local heavy rain in a short period of time might still be possible with unexpected short flash floods. #### 6.4 Drought forecast

Next week, the LMB is likely to experience normal conditions, no drought over the region based on the Combined Drought Index.

**Figure 13** below shows the weekly forecasts of SPI and CDI from 11 - 17 November over the LMB area.




Figure 13. Weekly forecasts of SPI and CDI from 11 – 17 November.

## 7 Summary and Possible Implications

#### 7.1. Rainfall and its forecast

In the period of 04 - 10 November 2025, there has been moderate to heavy rainfall has been observed over the LMB including in the central and southern parts of Lao PDR, the eastern part of Cambodia, the 3S basin, and the Mekong delta.

During 11 - 17 November 2025, the accumulated rainfall over the entire Lower Mekong Basin is distributed with light to moderate rain.

#### 7.2. Water level and its forecast

At 22 key monitoring stations along the Mekong mainstream from 03 - 10 November 2025, water levels are below the long-term averages (LTAs) except for water level at Nongkhai and Paksane stations. However, the 6 monitoring stations remain in normal condition with respect to the flow threshold (PMFM Thresholds). It is also the same condition for Tan Chau and Chau Doc monitoring stations, which are significantly influenced by sea tidal fluctuation.

In the period of 11 – 17 November 2025, the water levels from Chaing Saen and Luang Prabang are expected to decrease, while from Chaing Khan to Paksane, they are expected to increase. From Nakhon Phanom, water levels are expected to drop. At Tan Chau and Chau Doc stations, the water levels are predicted to be also fluctuated, resulting from the influence of sea tidal patterns. Water levels at all stations are expected to continue being above their long-term averages (LTAs).

#### 7.3. Flash flood and its trends


With the predicted of rainfall for the coming week as mentioned earlier in <u>section 6.1</u>, major flash floods are not likely to happen in the LMB.


#### 7.4. Drought condition and its forecast


During 04 - 11 November 2025, the LMB is experiencing normal conditions, no drought over the region. The monitored drought is caused primarily by meteorological indicator and combined drought indicator.

During 11 - 17 November 2025, the LMB is likely at normal conditions. No drought is forecasted for next week for the whole region.
