### Weekly Flood Situation Report for the Mekong River Basin

Prepared at: 18/09/2017, covering the week from the 11<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> September 2017

#### General Behaviour of the Mekong River and Flood Situation

##### Over weather situation

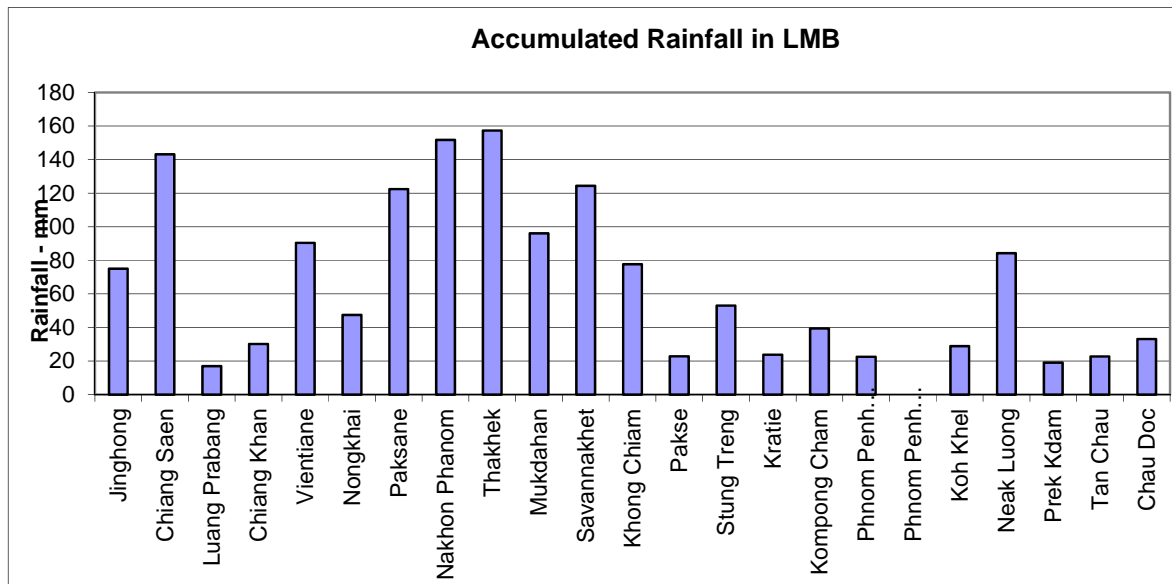


Figure 1: Accumulated Rainfall Distribution over the LMB from 11<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> September 2017

During last week, there was heavy rainfall (induced by typhoon “DOKSURI”) happened in many parts of the LMB, most of heavy rainfalls happened in the upper and middle reaches of LMB. The first three maximum accumulated rainfalls were at Chiang Saen (143.1 mm.), Nakhon Phanom (151.7 mm.) and Thakhek (157.3 mm.), see Figure 1 and Table A2 for more details.

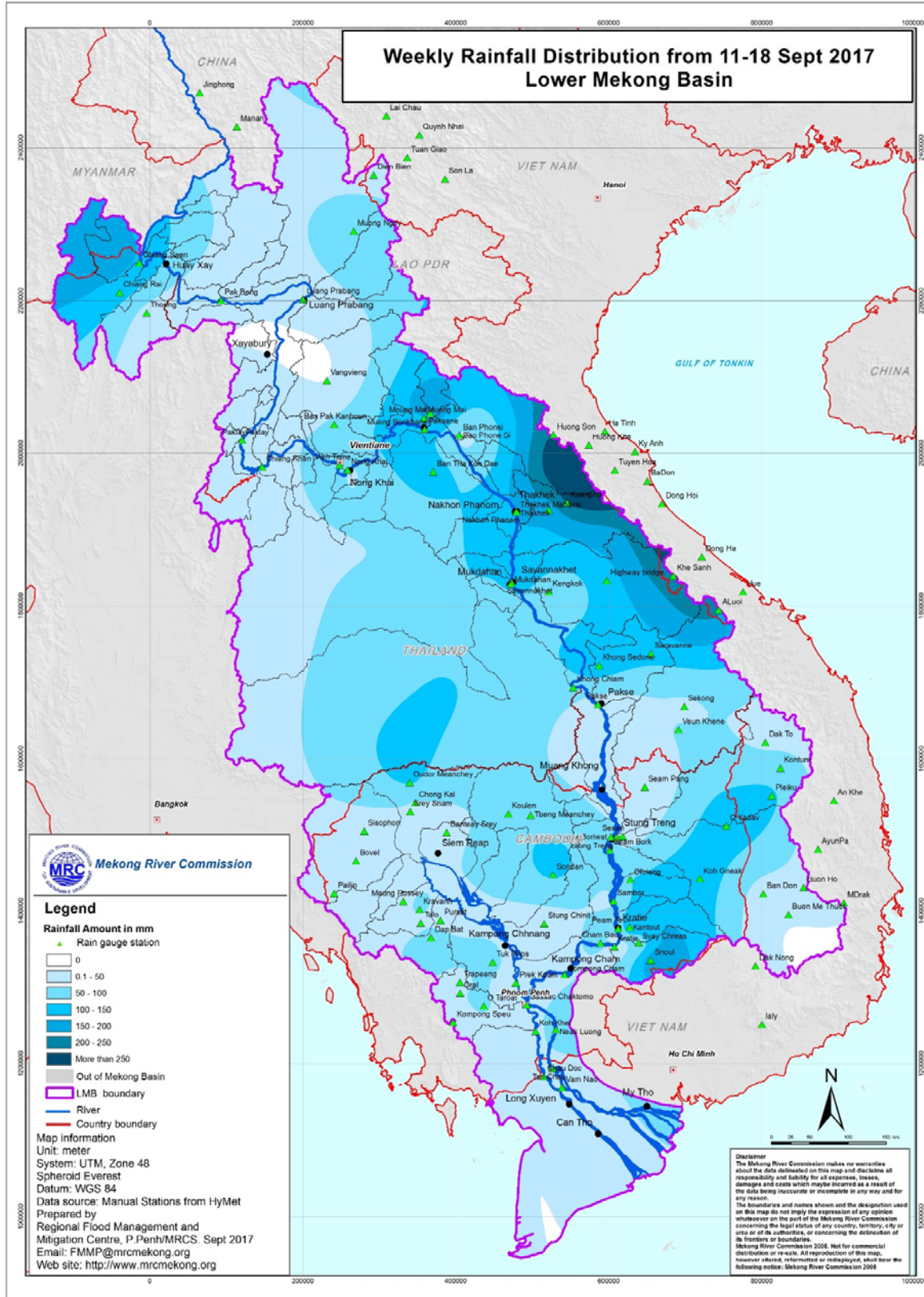


Figure 2: Weekly Rainfall Distribution over the LMB from 11<sup>th</sup> - 18<sup>th</sup> September 2017

### **General behaviour of the Mekong River**

Compared the Long Term Average (LTA) during last week, the water levels in the upper to middle reaches and lower reach of LMB were fluctuated above or about and below the LTA, respectively.

#### ***For stations from Chiang Saen and Luang Prabang***

During the last week, the water levels at these stations were fluctuated above the LTA.

#### ***For stations from Chiang Khan, Vientiane and Nong Khai and Paksane***

During the last week, the water levels at these stations were fluctuated above the LTA.

#### ***For stations from Thakhet/Nakhon Phanom to Pakse***

During the last week, the water levels at these stations were fluctuated above or about the LTA.

#### ***For stations from Stung Treng to Kampong Cham***

During the last week, the water levels at these stations were fluctuated below the LTA.

#### ***For stations from Phnom Penh to Koh Khel/Neak Luong***

During the last week, the water levels at these stations were fluctuated below the LTA except Koh Khel that was about the LTA.

#### ***Tan Chau and Chau Doc***

During the last week, the water levels at these stations were fluctuated below the LTA.

**Note:** For areas between forecast stations, please refer to the nearest forecast station.

### **Flood Situation**

- Flood stage or alarm stage:

No alarm stage (where the forecast is expected to reach flood level within three days) was reported anywhere on the mainstream of the Mekong River during the last week. Water levels were still significantly below flood levels (as defined by the national agency) at all forecast stations.

- Damage or victims:

No damage or loss of life due to river flooding was recorded anywhere along the Mekong River during the last week.

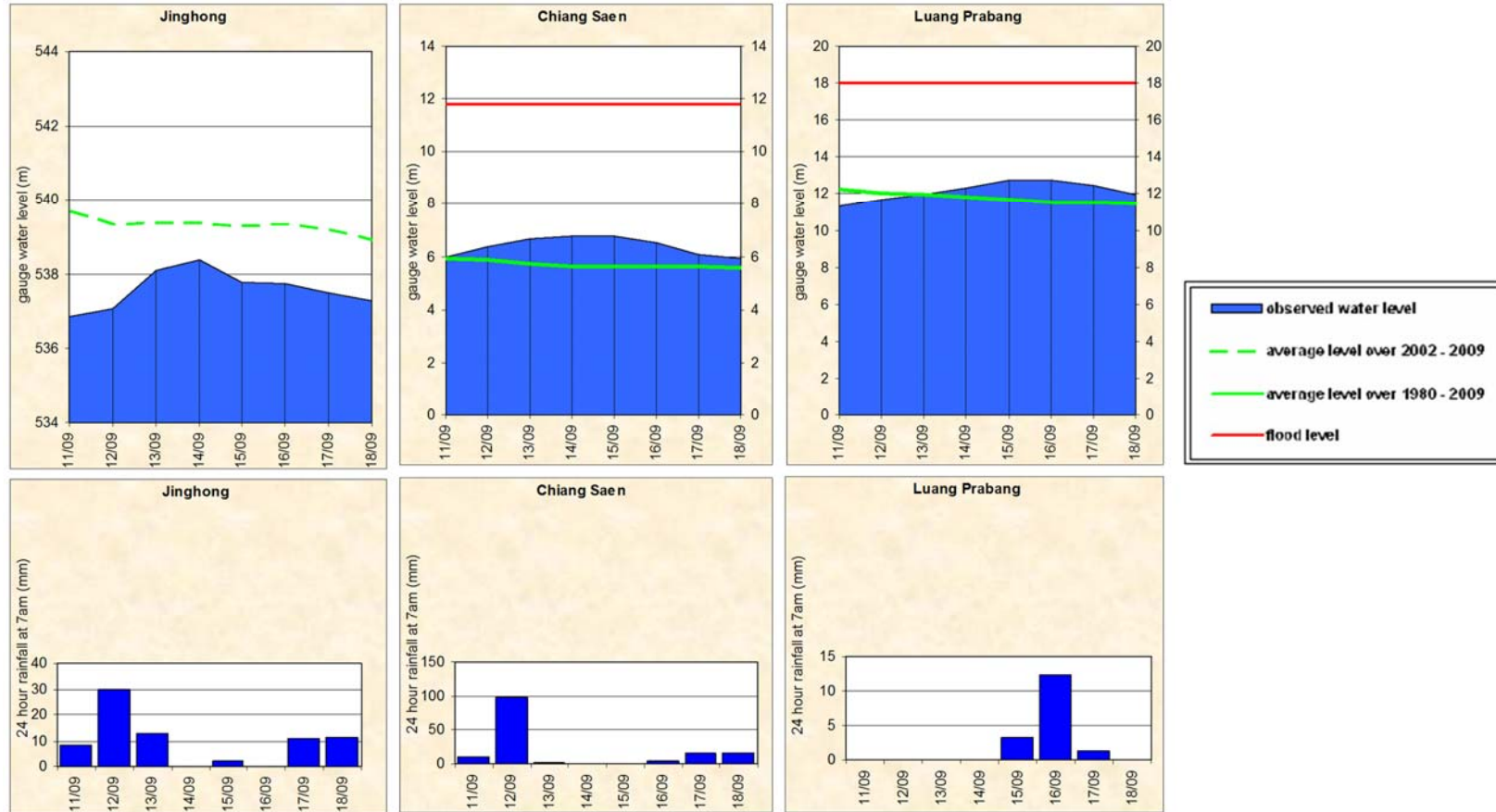

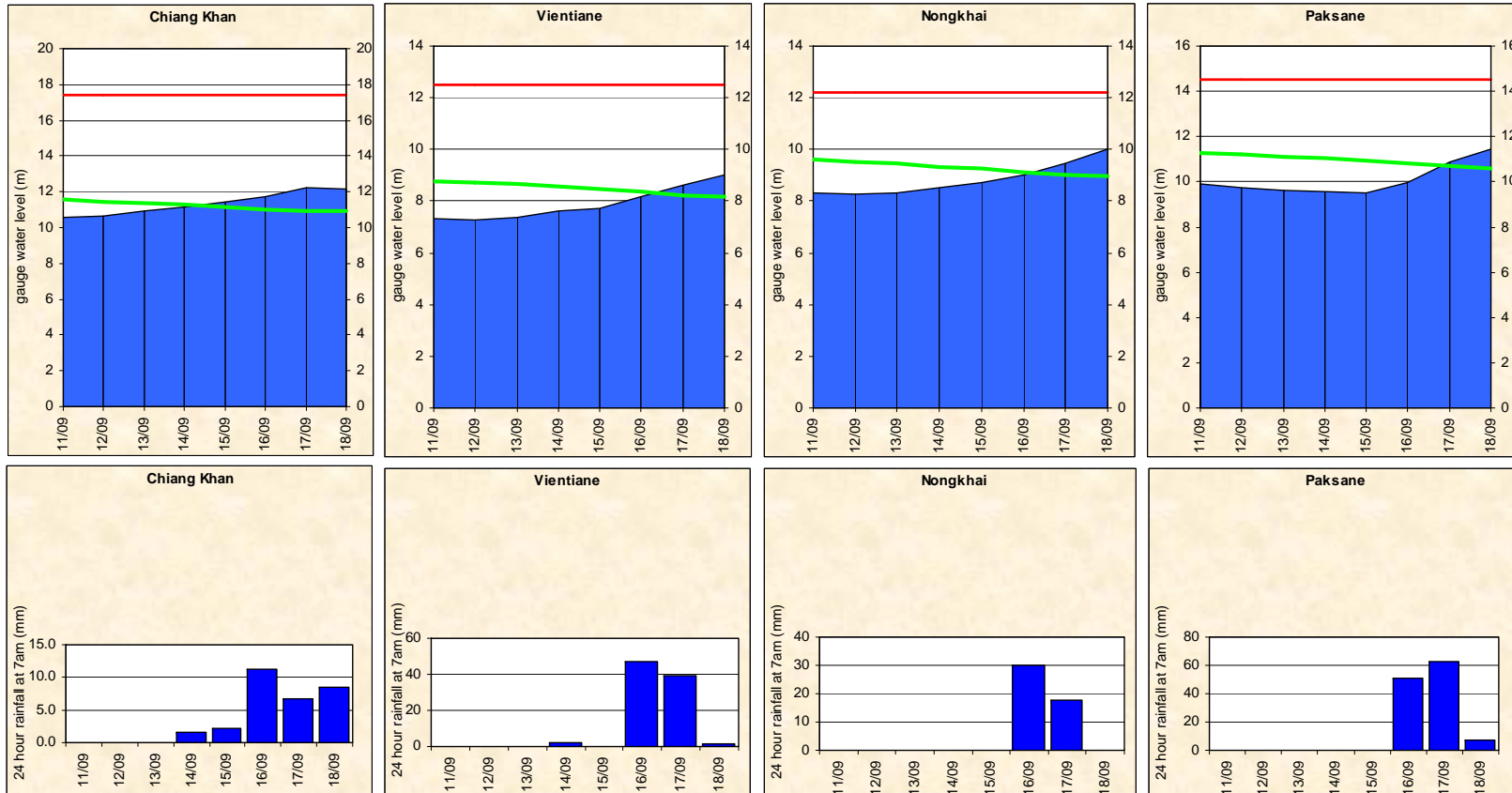

Figure A1: Observed water level and rainfall for Jinghong, Chiang Saen, and Luang Prabang



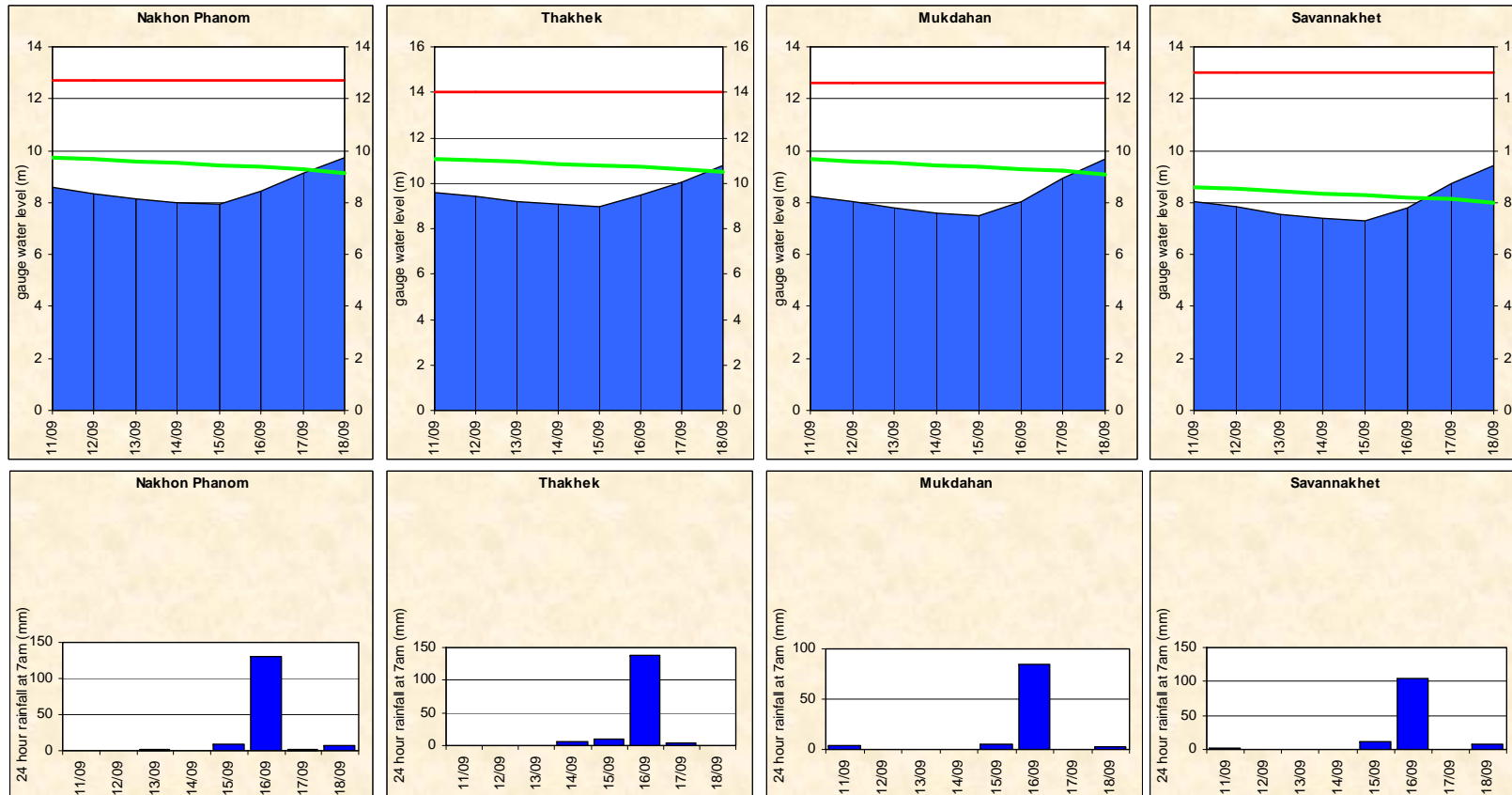

Figure A2: Observed water level and rainfall for Chiang Khan, Vientiane, Nongkhai, and Paksane



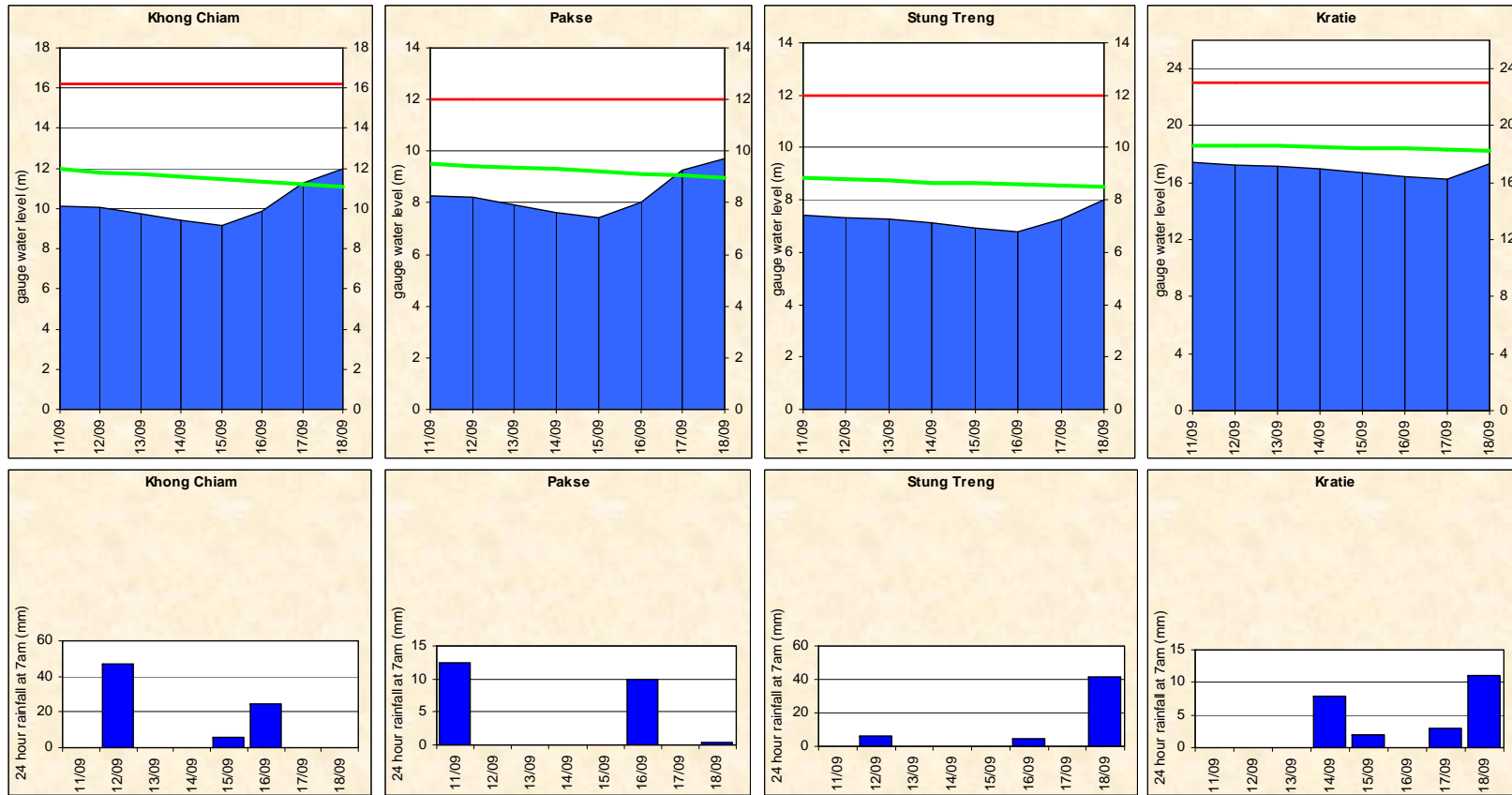

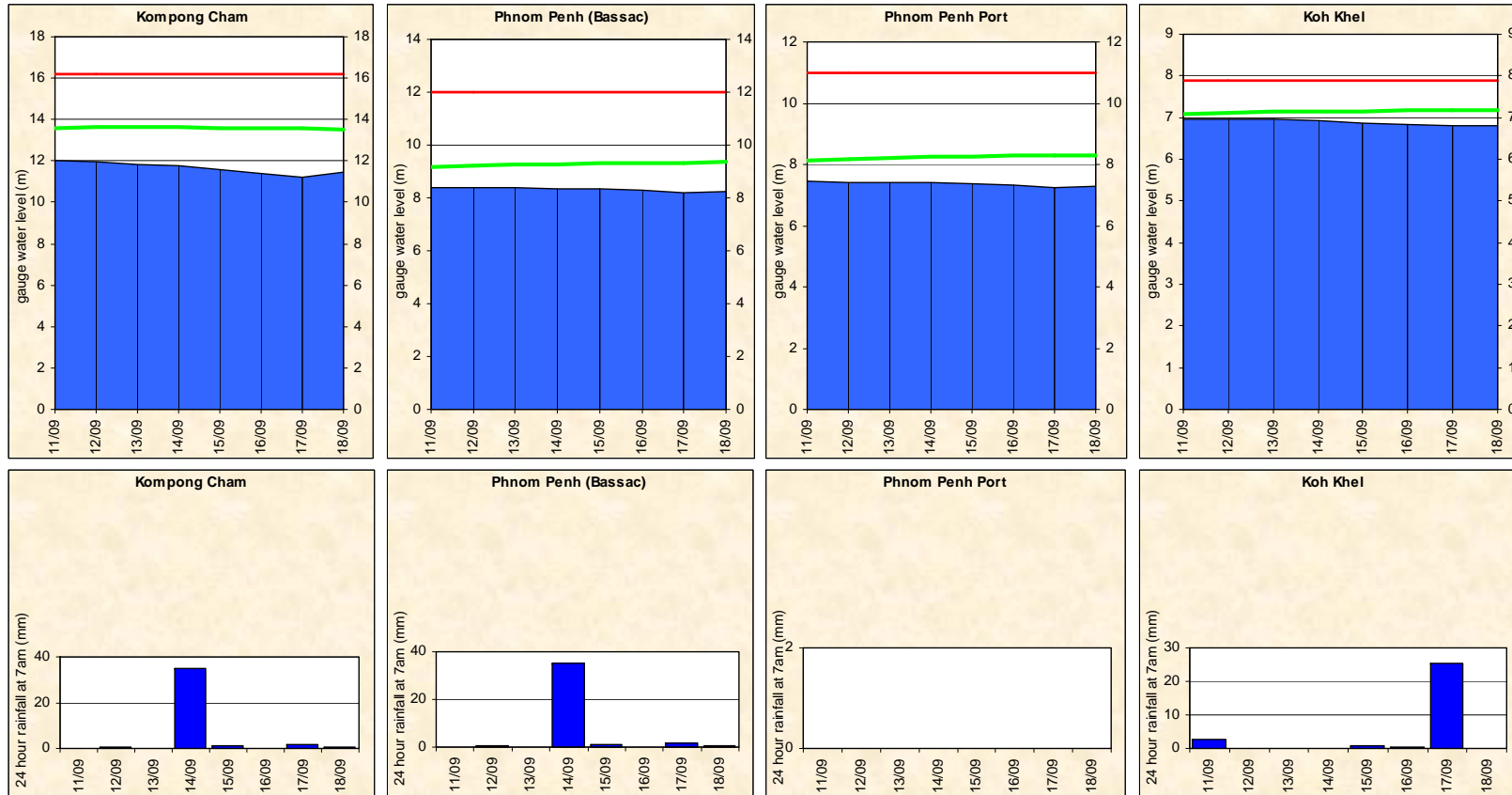
Figure A4: Observed water level and rainfall for Khong Chiam, Pakse, Stung Treng, and Kratie





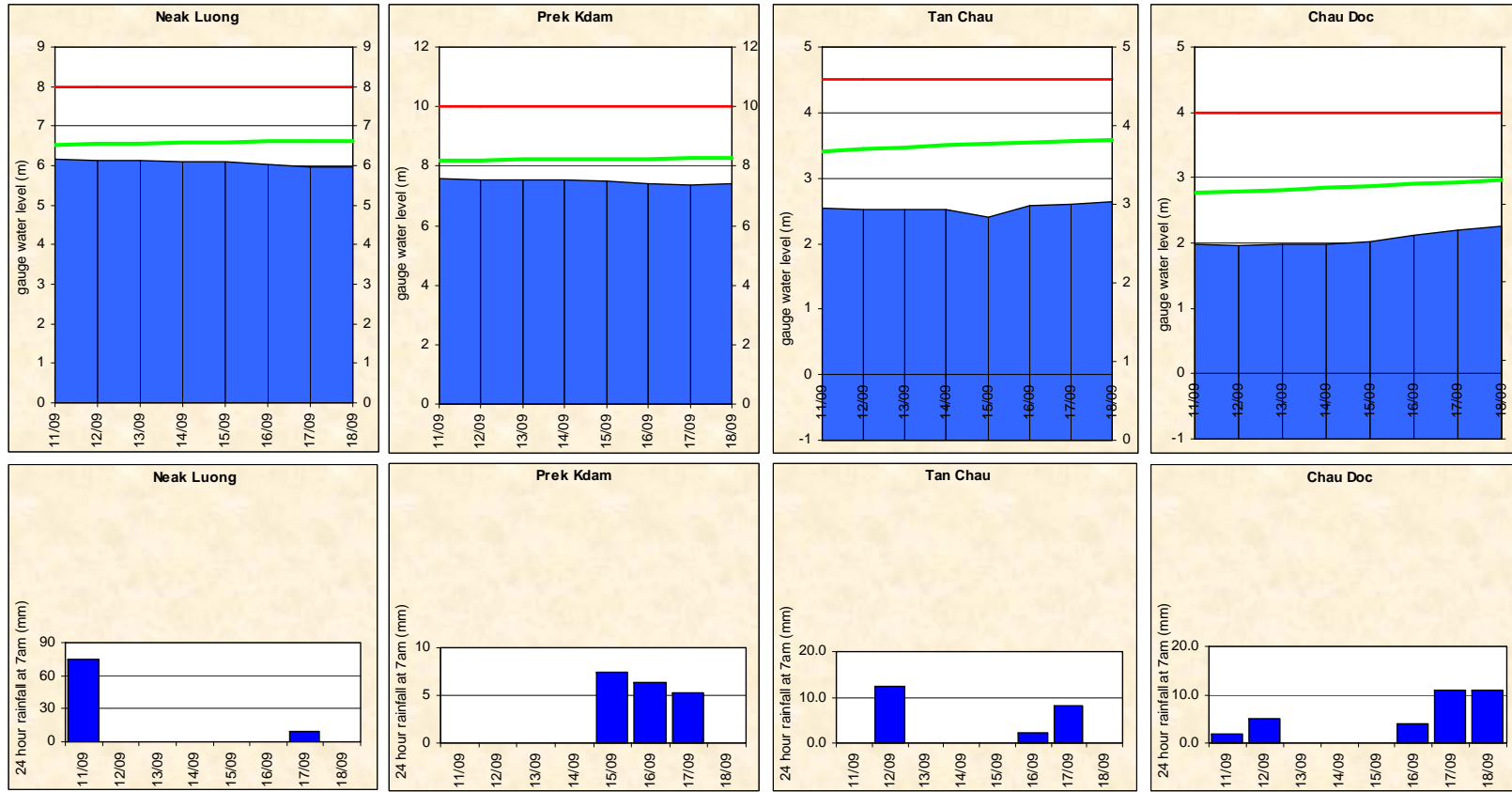

## Annex B: Accuracy and performance

### Accuracy

“Accuracy” describes the accuracy of the adjusted and published forecast, based on the results of the MRC Mekong Flood Forecasting System, which are then adjusted by the Flood Forecaster in Charge taking into consideration known biases in input data and his/her knowledge of the response of the model system and the hydrology of the Mekong River Basin. The information is presented as a graph below, showing the average flood forecasting accuracy along the Mekong mainstream.

In general, the overall accuracy is good for 1-day to 5-day forecast lead time at all stations in the LMB. However, the accuracies at Paksane,

Nakhon Phanom, Khong Chiam and Pakse for 1-day, Paksane, to Pakse and 3-day to 4-day forecast were less than expected.

The above differences due to two main factors: (1) internal model functionality in forecasting; for which the parameter adjustment in the model is not possible especially at stations in the upper part and in the Mekong delta where are affected by tidal; (2) the adjustment by utilizing the practical knowledge and experience of flood forecaster-in-charge; (3) the heavy rainfall happened in many tributaries inside the LMB. 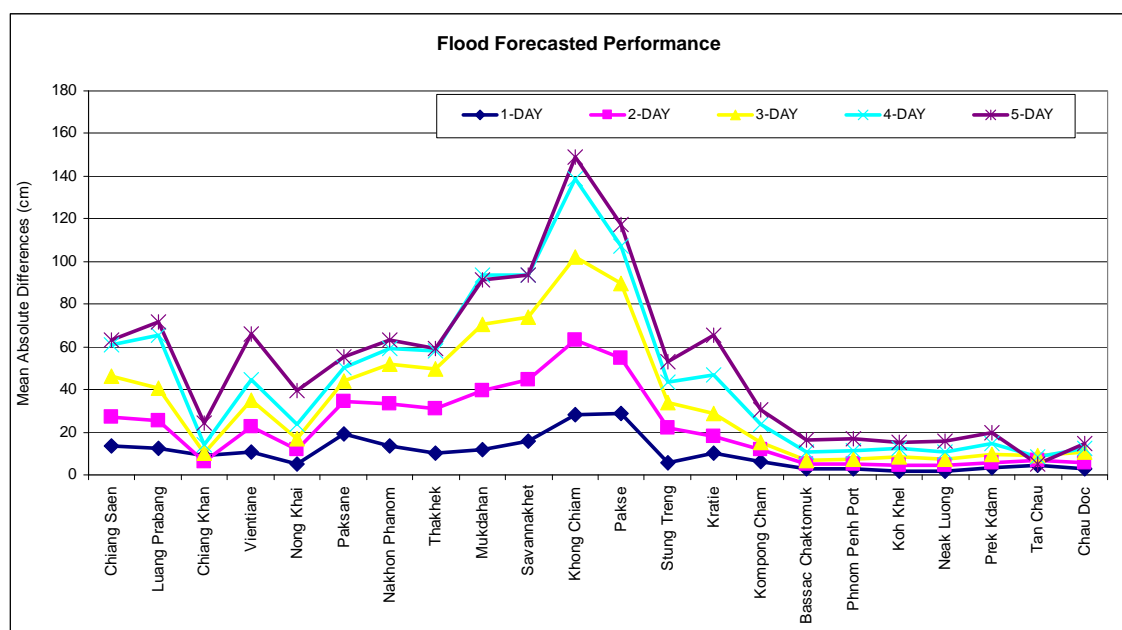


Figure B1: Average flood forecast accuracy along the Mekong mainstream (from 11<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> September 2017)

### Forecast Achievement

The forecast achievement indicates the % of days that the forecast at a particular station for a lead-time is successful against a respective benchmark (Table B2).

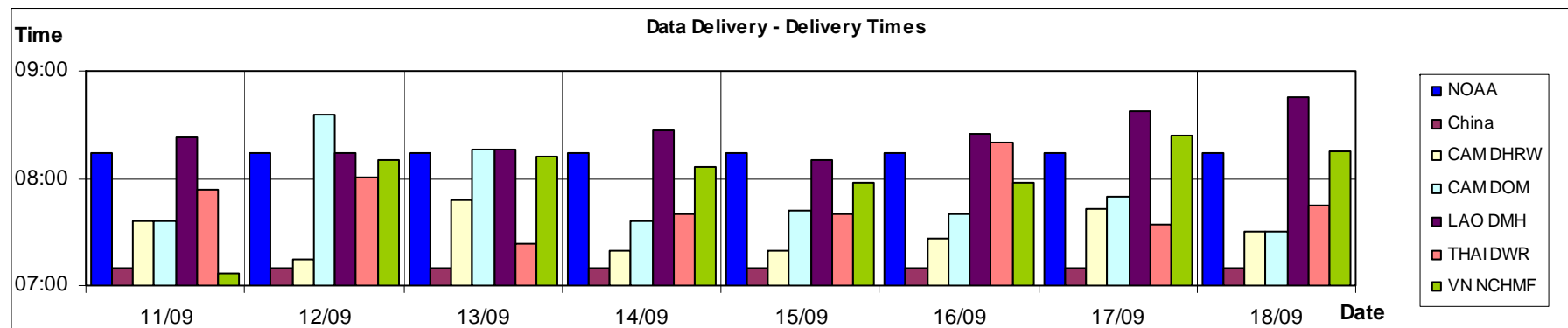


Figure B2: Data delivery times for the past 8 days including the current report date

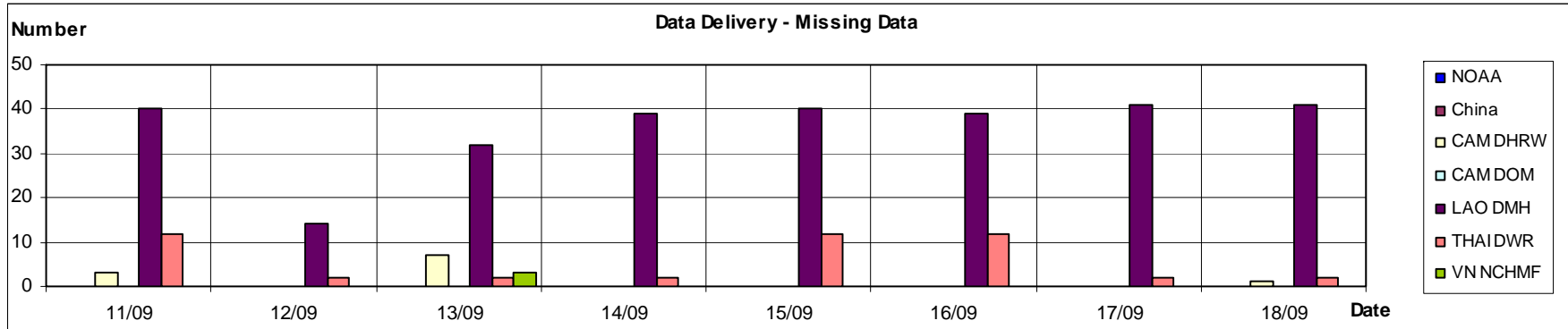


Figure B3: Missing data for the past 8 days including the current report date

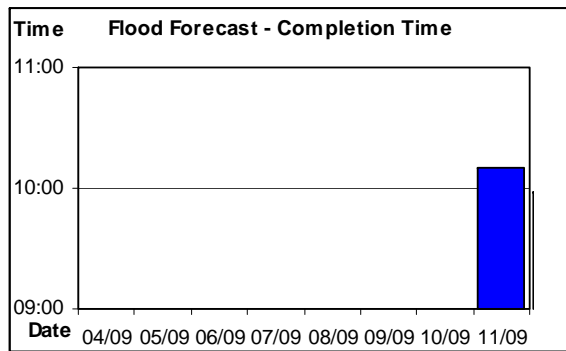


Figure B4: Flood forecast completion time

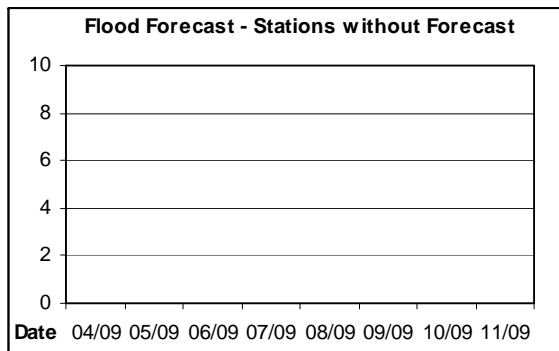


Figure B5: Flood forecast stations without forecast

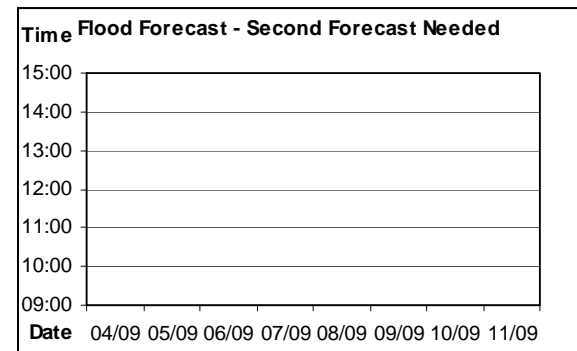


Figure B6: Second forecast needed
